Creative and digital industries represent \$90 billion to the economy and in 2018 employed around 8% of the Australian workforce\*, which is more than mining and agriculture.

# EMPLOYMENT GROWTH IN THE PHOTOGRAPHY INDUSTRY

- The number of people working as Photographers (in their main job) grew over the past 5 years
- The photography industry employed around 13,000 people in 2020\*
- Around 50% of jobs were full-time
- This number is expected to continue to grow
- There are likely to be around 9,000 job openings over 5 years (that's about 1,800 a year)


### Art photography

Exhibiting photo artist, photo-media artist, local and overseas artist residencies, moving image/installation, digital media artist


### Image management


