APPLICATION, ADMISSION CRITERIA AND ENROLMENT

Admission criteria

Undergraduate Certificate CRICOS Course Code: 105886F

Completion of the relevant course International Student Application form

Evidence of completion of Secondary School Year 12 or equivalent

Photographic folio of your creative work 8 to 10 images*

Interview

Your folio of images must be your own work. The work should demonstrate creative potential and an aptitude for photography. Selection is based on successfully meeting all the admission criteria and participation in the interview with your folio of creative work (if you are in Australia already if not a skype interview can be arranged).

Meet specific academic and/or professional entrance requirements

Evidence of Bachelor with Honours or Bachelor Degree qualification or equivalent

Applicants must complete and submit the Pre selection kit as part of their application.

Interview

Applicants are required to attend an interview with their folio of work and have completed all Pre selection requirements.

Advanced standing and credit transfer

PSC will ensure that all prospective students with relevant prior experience (RPL) or academic studies (credit transfer) are advised of the possibility of having this prior experience and/or studies taken into consideration. Credit can reduce the amount of study needed to complete a degree.

Enrolment

Successful applicants will be advised in a formal Photography Studies College Letter of Offer.

To accept the offer you are required to complete the International Student Enrolment Form and pay the Administration Fee and amount of the annual Tuition Fees together with the Overseas Student Health Cover payment. Once these payments are received and processed an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) will be issued. Once you receive your eCoE you can apply for a student visa at your nearest diplomatic mission – as noted on your eCoE. Please note that the PSC Refund Policy is clearly stated on the International Enrolment Form.

Annual Tuition Fees

Please refer to the International Tuition Fee Schedule.

Equipment Costs

In addition to the annual international tuition fees, there are additional essential equipment and material costs – refer to the PSC Expenses Other than Tuition Fees Sheet for details.

Overseas Student Health Cover

To be covered for health insurance costs and as a visa requirement, you will have to pay the Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for yourself and any family members travelling with you at the time of enrolment. The OSHC provides medical and hospital insurance. Photography Studies College's OSHC provider is Medibank Private. For further information: www.medibankprivate.com.au

APPLYING FOR A STUDENT VISA

PSC is a registered Higher Education Provider. Students require a Student Visa - Subclass 500.

Student visa requirements

- Your will need:
 - A current Photography Studies College (Melbourne) letter of offer into the relevant Higher Education course
 - An electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE)
 - Proof of financial support for your period of study
 - A valid passport
- You may be required to undergo certain health checks as part of your visa application.

Documentary evidence for student visas

Prior to submitting your student visa application, you must check against the Document Checklist tool on the Department of Home Affairs website go to Visa Options for studying in Australia to find out which documents need to be attached to your visa application. Documentary evidence is determined by the Country of Passport and education provider.

Working while you study

The Australian Government has temporarily extended working hours for student visa holders. You will be able to work more than 40 hours a fortnight in any sector of the economy.

Educational services for overseas students (ESOS) act

The Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) framework provides quality education and protects the rights of international students in Australia. Arranging travel

You are responsible for making your own travel arrangements to Australia. It is advisable that you arrive in Melbourne at least 1-2 weeks before classes commence so that you have time to settle in and find suitable accommodation.






Remember to check with your airline on the baggage allowance that your ticket allows.

Orientation and settling in

At PSC we work to ensure that all international students have a productive and fulfilling educational experience. Our Student Services and Wellness Officer is available to assist with information on accommodation and settling in. In the first week of the course an Orientation Program is provided to ensure that all International Students are familiarised with PSC, the course and with studying and living in Australia. The relevant PSC International Student Handbook provides details of assistance, lists of policies and rules and rights that are applicable.

COST OF LIVING

Australian currency

Australian currency is denominated as follows:

Notes	\$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100
Coins	5c, 10c, 20c, 50c, \$1, \$2
There are no 1c or 2c coins.	

Items in Australia are priced down to single cents (for example \$2.99) but when you pay, the total will be rounded up or down to the nearest five cents. Thus \$2.99 becomes \$3.00, and \$12.42 becomes \$12.40.

As with all currencies, the Australian dollar exchange rate can vary over short periods of time. You can find the current exchange rate or convert to your own currency at www.xe.com

Minimum cost of living

There are financial requirements you must meet in order to receive a student visa. As of October 2019, the 12-month living costs are:

For students	AUD\$21,041
For partners coming with you	AUD\$7,362
For a child coming with you	AUD\$3,152

Hostels and Guest houses	\$90 to \$150 per week
Shared Rental	\$95 to \$215 per week
Homestay	\$235 to \$325 per week
Rental	\$185 to \$440 per week

Other living expenses

Groceries and eating out	\$140 to \$280 per week
Gas, electricity	\$10 to \$20 per week
Phone and Internet	\$15 to \$30 per week
Public transport	\$20 to \$60 per week
Car (after purchase)	\$150 to \$260 per week
Entertainment	\$80 to \$150 per week

* The costs quoted here are only an indication of every day expenses and do not include accommodation, return airfares, overseas student health cover (OSHC) or course fees and costs. Don't forget to take these into consideration before lodging your application.

CHECKLIST

In preparation for coming to Australia here are some important things to consider:

- ☐ A current valid passport
- ☐ Student visa
- ☐ Ensure you check Australia's definition of fully vaccinated for international travel purposes
- ☐ Apply for a credit card and or arrange sufficient funds
- ☐ Confirm overseas access to your fund with your bank
- ☐ Arrange travel insurance
- ☐ Arrange accommodation
- ☐ Arrange transport from Melbourne airport to accommodation
- ☐ Ensure sufficient funds for taxi, bus or phone in case of emergency.

Important documents to pack

- ☐ Passport
- ☐ Letter of offer and electronic confirmation of enrolment (eCoE)
- ☐ Travel insurance policy
- ☐ ID cards, drivers' license, birth certificate (or copy)
- ☐ Leave copies of these documents in a safe place in your home country in case of loss.

Other items you may want to bring from home or purchase in Melbourne

- ☐ Camera and accessories (Refer to PSC Expenses other than tuition fees information sheet)
- ☐ Linen
- ☐ Bath towels
- ☐ Toiletries
- ☐ Mobile phone
- ☐ Laptop
- ☐ Australian standard electrical plug or adaptor

Other items

Make sure you are fully aware of what you can and cannot bring into Australia. Also be aware of the strict quarantine rules that apply when entering Australia. If you have any doubt about whether your goods are prohibited, then you should declare it on your Incoming Passenger Card. This will be provided to you on the plane. Melbourne and Australia may have a different climate to what you have experienced so be sure to pack clothing for all weather conditions and seasons. You will be arriving in February which is our final month of summer. Autumn is from March to May, winter June to August, spring from September to November and summer December to February.
